Roybal named director of manufactured housing division

SANTA FE – The new head of the New Mexico Regulation and Licensing Department's Manufactured Housing Division is an experienced administrator whose career includes enforcing the state's Manufactured Housing Act.

Amanda Roybal will take the reins immediately in the Manufactured Housing Division, Superintendent Marguerite Salazar announced Tuesday.

Most recently, Roybal has been an investigations and enforcement chief in the department's Boards and Commission's Division. In that role, she supervised criminal investigators who handled more than 1,200 cases annually for violations of the Construction Industries Licensing, the Manufactured Housing Act and the LP and CNG Act.

The Manufactured Housing Division ensures that manufactured homes are well-constructed and safe, that homes are installed correctly, that consumers are provided fair and effective remedies, and that measures are taken to provide economic stability for the New Mexico manufactured housing industry.

"Amanda understands the importance of safety and regulatory requirements while recognizing the ever-changing needs of the manufactured housing industry. She will be a great asset to the Manufactured Housing Division" Salazar said.

Roybal began her career with the State of New Mexico in 2008 as an administrator working with stakeholders to develop legislation and draft regulations to comply with the State Rules Act.

"I am eager to maintain standards of safety for all manufactured homes, factory-built buildings and accessory structures. These standards promote the health, safety and welfare of New Mexico citizens," Roybal said.

The New Mexico Regulation and Licensing Department regulates more than 425,000 individuals and businesses in 35 industries, professions and trades across the state. Its goal is to assure that New Mexicans receive quality services from qualified individuals and businesses while also ensuring fair and prompt administrative process.
