

6. I surrendered my DEA registration in 2013. My New Mexico osteopath license has expired and I am not currently practicing as a doctor of osteopathic medicine.

7. In order to resolve this matter without the need for a disciplinary hearing, I agree to the following terms:

a. I agree to cease permanently from self-treating and self-prescribing for any medical condition requiring the use of controlled substances.

b. I agree that should I seek to re-activate my New Mexico osteopath license I will comply with the following terms and provide documentation to the Board along with my application:

1) I agree to contact the New Mexico Monitored Treatment Program (MTP), set up an appointment with them, and comply with their recommendations and requirements, and to provide the Board with documentation that I have done these things.

2) I agree to seek an evaluation with a pain specialist and to provide the Board with documentation that I have done this.

3) I agree to seek a psychiatric evaluation and to provide the Board with documentation that I have done this, as well as a release of information allowing the records pertaining to this evaluation to be released to the Board.

8. I understand that this settlement constitutes disciplinary action.

9. I have read this entire agreement and fully understand each provision.

10. I understand that I have the right to have the Board issue a Notice of Contemplated Action, the right to request a hearing, and the right to discovery, pursuant to the Uniform Licensing Act (Sections 61-1-1 through 61-1-31, NMSA 1978), and I am waiving those rights.

11. I knowingly, intelligently and freely agree with the terms and conditions of this settlement and consent thereto.

12. In order for the Board to have time to review and consider this settlement agreement I waive the right to have a Notice of Contemplated Action issued within two-year Uniform Licensing Act statute of limitations.


