**NEW MEXICO REAL ESTATE COMMISSION  
RENEWAL PROCESS AND PROCEDURES  
DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH  
EMERGENCY**

Due to the public health emergency declared by Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham in Executive Order 2020-004, and to the cancellation of continuing education (CE) opportunities, the New Mexico Real Estate Commission implemented the following procedures through the Regulation and Licensing Department, Boards and Commissions staff:

- Boards and Commissions staff will process renewals without the proof of CE credit needed for renewal during the pendency of the public health emergency instituted by Executive Order 2020-004.
- Licensees submitting renewals without the sufficient CE credits, will be required to give notice to the commission through the notice procedures established by the public email noticed on March 17, 2020, and posted on the Commission's website at:  
[http://www.rld.state.nm.us/boards/Real\\_Estate\\_Commission.aspx](http://www.rld.state.nm.us/boards/Real_Estate_Commission.aspx).
- If all other license renewal requirements are met, licenses will be renewed without proof of CE credits.
- When the public health emergency is lifted, Boards and Commissions staff will send out a notice to licensees that did not submit proof of CE credit, stating that the licensee has three (3) months to submit their proof of CE or be subject to discipline by the Commission.

Effective July 1, 2020, the New Mexico Real Estate Commission will discontinue the procedures described above as CE courses are available online.

Licensees who have already been approved for CE suspension have up until ninety (90) days after the Public Health Emergency is lifted to submit proof of CE Credits. However, the Commission recommends that all licensees who did not submit proof of CE credits, seek online courses and submit proof of CE credits prior to that time.
